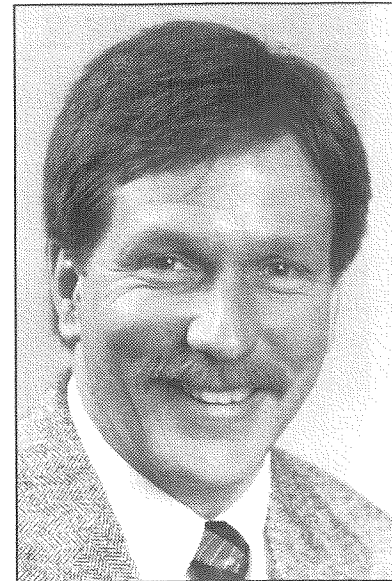


Oscar Blatchly, P.E.

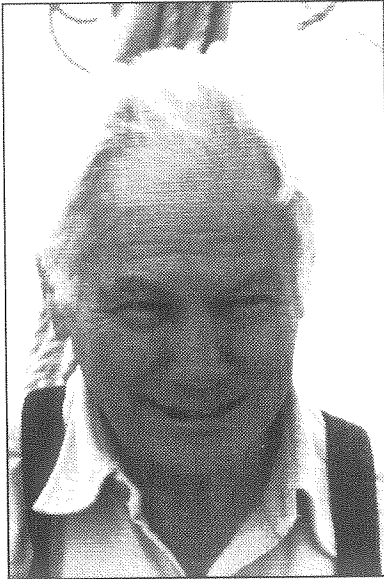

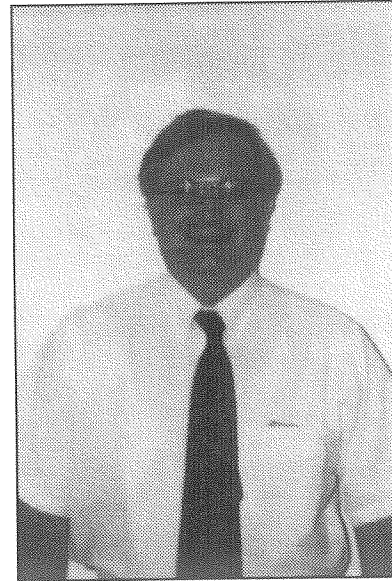
Ted Mead, P.E.

Ted is married to Trisch and has two children, Colin and Lesley from a previous marriage.

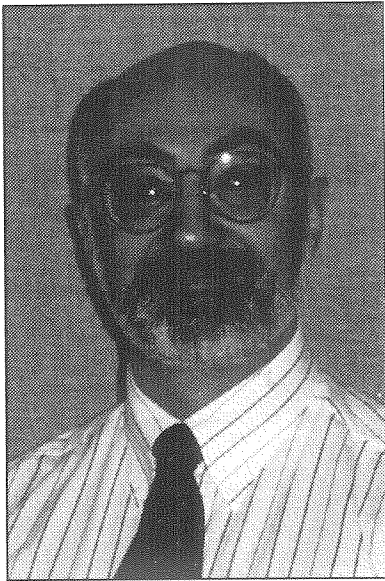

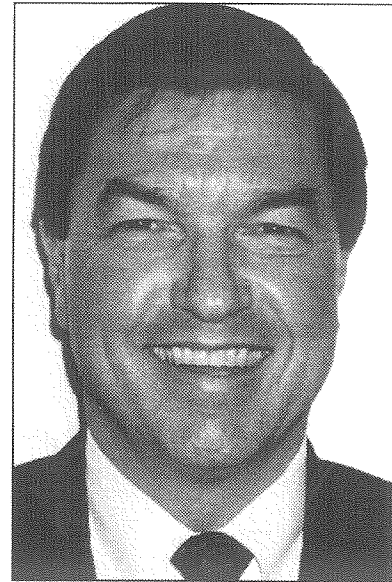


Edward Seraydarian
