Jerry Kelman has worked in the northeast for most of his life in residential and commercial contracting and then as a manufacturers representative for several manufacturers including Desertaire, McQuay, York and Copeland Compressors. He became national sales manager for Rawal Devices in 2009. Rawal has been in business for 18 years selling their products in the OEM market as well as through distribution markets.

Walt Joncas has worked with Hy-Save Technology since 1988. He worked with Robert Hyde who in 1986 invented and patented the first practical, magnetically coupled liquid refrigerant pump. Walt worked closely with Robert Hyde and was involved with experimentation and development of the apparatus resulting in ten additional liquid refrigerant pumping patents containing over 100 claims. For the past 22 years Walt has traveled the US training technicians and engineers in the use of refrigerant pumps. He has lectured at UVM, Cornell, University of Massachusetts, Northeastern, Brown and several SUNY campuses. He has presented to many Region 1 ASHRAE and RSES chapters as well as to audiences at DOE, FEMP, DOD, NIST, AEE and AFE. Walt is considered by his piers to be the most knowledgeable liquid refrigerant pumping expert in the USA.

Walt holds two recent patents jointly with Peter Bailey and Greg Dodge that received ASHRAE Region 1 honors and honorable mention from ASHRAE International this past year.
