### **Technology Transfer**

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all ASHRAE members who attended last month's meeting. Chris Mathis, our Distinguished Lecturer delivered two informative and enlightening presentations that were well received by the attendees.

March's program will feature two presentations on chilled water systems. The first presentation will be given by John Morris of Motivair on how to apply free cooling and heat recovery for energy savings on mission critical applications (data centers and medical equipment as examples). John will share with us how to efficiently cool a data center without sacrificing reliability, discuss new and innovative technologies to help keep pace with high density servers and how modern rack cooling systems can eliminate 'hot spots' and make your data center white space 'heat neutral'. He will also tell us how to reduce the 'carbon footprint' of data centers.

The second presentation will be given by Mike Hayes of the Smardt Chiller Group who will be discussing magnetic bearing compressors and chillers. Mike will tell us what a magnetic bearing compressor is, how it works and how they are applied to chiller technologies. He will inform us of the benefits of these systems especially in the areas of part load efficiency and low life cycle cost as well as their reliability, low noise and capability to provide redundancy in some cases.
