**Architectural Engineering Technology SPRING 2011 SEMESTER (January – May 2011)** 

Vermont Technical College is seeking a part-time Architectural Engineering Technology faculty member for Spring 2011 for the Randolph Center campus to teach Plumbing Systems.

The instructor for this course should be able to teach the basic practices and techniques for the design of plumbing systems in buildings.
