
RESEARCH PROMOTION

Since that time our committee has been checking the State of Vermont Legislation website for news or a posting related to the Master's or Equiv/Bachelor's + 30 bill which was expected to be brought forward during this legislation session. As of the date of this report, nothing has been posted on the Vermont State Legislation web site related to this bill, and according to reliable sources, it appears that it will be pushed off to the 2014-2015 legislation session. We will continue to monitor the website and report on information as it develops.

In other State Legislation news, there is a bill currently titled "An Act Relating to the Regulation of Net Metering" that is currently "In Committee" (bill H.604). This bill was brought to the floor on 1/15/14. Our GGAC Committee will be reviewing the proposed changes within the bill and report on the highlights of the proposed changes to our ASHRAE Chapter members. 

PAST PRESIDENT'S MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Past President's Memorial Scholarship was founded in 1991. At that time, five companies, GWR Engineering, Hallam Engineering, Avengco Engineering, Hertzberg Engineering, and Mechanical Consulting Services, contributed to create the scholarship given in the memory of Tom Wolfstich.

Tom Wolfstich had his roots in Albany, NY following in his father's footsteps as a union plumber and pipe fitter. He came to Vermont in 1979 to run the plumbing division at New England Air Systems Inc, a company Miller Bobby had



created a few years earlier. Tom was known for his skills in lay out and installing piping systems for large projects, especially renovation work. He was also known for his contagious sense of humor and playing pranks on colleagues. In 1984, Tom, along with Steve Bartlett and John Lawrence, bought New England Air Systems Inc from Bobby Miller. About that same time, Tom started getting involved in ASHRAE and started to advance through the Board of Governors chairs. In 1988-1989, Tom was the President of the Champlain Valley Chapter of ASHRAE. He was also very active in the local chapter of the Plumbing, Heating and Cooling contractors association, PHCC. In March 1991, Tom died unexpectedly of complications from lung cancer that was connected to asbestos exposure through the years. His wife Janis and three children, two of who still

live in Vermont, survive him.

The award has changed somewhat over the years. There are many companies that contribute \$100.00 each to create the scholarship fund. The ASHRAE Champlain Valley Chapter has also lost some of our other past president's and decided to rename the scholarship from the Thomas Wolfstich Memorial Scholarship to the Past President's Memorial Scholarship.

If you would like to contribute to the scholarship fund, please address your correspondence to the address noted below.

The scholarship committee decides whom to award the scholarship to each year. The equirements include enrollment in a four-year college with completion of at least three semesters or enrollment in a two-year college with completion of at least two semesters, Enrolment in the college's mechanical engineering or architectural engineering program, a minimum verall 3.0 grade point average, the student must demonstrate a financial need, and shows interest in pursuing a career in an ASHRAE oriented field. At the discretion of the scholarship committee, there can be one award or multiple awards given each year. The scholarship is paid directly to the recipients' school in care of the winner.

Student applications are now being accepted for the Thomas Wolfstich scholarship award. A copy of the application is posted on our website www.ashraevt.com.

SUBJECT: PRESIDENTIAL AWARD OF EXCELLENCE (PAOE)

ASHRAE chapters are the backbone of the Society and play a central role in achieving its goals. Through our collective efforts, ASHRAE chapters are a vital, global driver of progress in building science and technology.

My Presidential theme, "Shaping the Next," focuses on the importance of goals, planning, and commitment to enable us to fulfill our responsibility to our world - making buildings safe, healthy, productive, comfortable environments in harmony with nature - by developing ourselves – the professional community and transforming our work – what we do, how we do it, and who we do it with.

The PAOE for the coming year reflects these points of emphasis. It also includes new section for Grassroots Government Activities, coinciding with the initiation of ASHRAE's new Grassroots Government Activities Committee (GGAC).

Highlights of new activities for which PAOE points will be awarded include:

75 points for establishing and updating annually a chapter long term strategic plan (minimum of 3 years) with goals for chapter growth, leadership, and financial stability.

100 points for a project that provides education and support for Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) in the professional community and/or Society at large

50 points for each chapter program on Indoor Air Quality/Environmental Health

50 points for each chapter program dealing with global issues

150 points for establishing and annually updating a list of government officials (at any level of government relevant to buildings, engineering or construction, including building officials, school system facility staff, state energy code officials, etc.) along with their contact information. In addition, translation of ASHRAE publications by Chapter members will now be given the same credit as authoring an article.

There are seven categories included in this year's PAOE: Chapter Operations, Chapter Technology Transfer, Grassroots Government Activities, Historical, Membership Promotion, Research Promotion, and Student Activities. To achieve PAOE, the chapter must earn the minimum points in five of the following six categories: Chapter Operations, Chapter Technology Transfer, Grassroots Government Activities, Membership Promotion, Research Promotion, and Student Activities. Please refer to the criteria specified in each of the categories for calculating the PAOE points. For additional information or clarification, consult the PAOE Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section on the ASHRAE website. Please note that appropriate documentation must be kept by the Chapter to support PAOE point input, and that "chair" is defined as the individual listed in the Chapter Information Questionnaire (CIQ) on file with Society.
