TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER

GRASSROOTS GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

Last month our Committee reported on a bill that was in our State legislation process. Bill H.604, titled "An Act Relating to the Regulation of Net Metering", is still noted to be "In Committee" with the Natural Resources and Energy. The bill proposes to require that net metering credits apply only to energy usage charges and not to the customer charge or energy efficiency charge billed by the electric company.

In addition to Bill H.604, there are other energy

related bills that are in the legislation process. These are summarized as noted below. A link to each bill is provided for use to obtain up to date status on the related bill.

H.0312 An act relating to the siting of electric generation facilities (In Committee-Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Energy) http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=H%2E0312&Session=2014

This bill proposes to require that in-state electric generation facilities conform with adopted municipal plans. This bill also gives municipalities the authority to adopt land use bylaws to regulate the siting of electric generation facilities, except for net metering systems.

H.0313 An act relating to the siting of electric generation facilities (In Committee-Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Energy) http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=H%2E0313&Session=2014

This bill proposes to move jurisdiction over the siting of in-state electric generation facilities, except for net metering systems, from the Public Service Board to the District Environmental Commissions. This bill also gives municipalities the authority to adopt land use bylaws to regulate siting of electric generation facilities, except for net metering systems.

H.0366 An Act relating to net metering systems serving industrial facilities and solar electrical generation (In Committee)

http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=H%2E0366&Session=2014

This bill proposes to increase the allowed capacity of net metering systems for industrial facilities and to standardize the definition of "plant capacity" as it

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applies to solar electric generation.

H.0648 An act relating to setbacks, screening, and siting of solar generation plants (In Committee-Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Energy) http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=H%2E0648&Session=2014

This bill proposes to require that solar generation plants comply with setback, screening, and other siting requirements adopted by the municipality.

H.0702 An act relating to self-generation and net metering (Senate floor action-referred to Committee on Finance)

http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=H%2E0702&Session=2014

This bill proposes to make two sets of changes to the statutes governing net metering systems. First, for effect in 2014, the bill proposes amendments regarding the cumulative output capacity of all net metering systems, the capacity of individual solar net metering systems, the required additional incentive for those systems, the ownership of renewable energy credits associated with net metering systems, the creation of a pilot project under which an electric cooperative would install net metering systems, and the ability of an electric company whose power supply portfolio is 90 percent renewable to implement an alternative net metering program.

Second, for effect in 2017, the bill would repeal the existing net metering statute and replace it with a statute that provides policy direction to the Public Service Board for a revised net metering program that would be governed by Board rules. The Board would develop these rules through a process to occur before 2017. This process would include a report by the Department

of Public Service to the Board followed by workshop and rulemaking proceedings on a revised program and a report by the Board to the General Assembly in 2016.

<u>S.0105 An act relating to regional planning for</u> renewable electric energy (Senate floor action- referred to Committee on Natural Resources and Energy) http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=S%2E0105&Session=2014

EB

This bill proposes to require regional planning commissions to plan for the siting of renewable electric energy plants.

S.0191 An act relating to setbacks and screening for solar generation plants (Senate floor action- referred to Committee on Natural Resources and Energy) http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=S%2E0191&Session=2014

This bill proposes to require that solar generation plants comply with setback and screening requirements adopted by the municipality.

S.0196 An act relating to the regulation of net metering (Senate floor action- referred to Committee on Finance) http://www.leg.state.vt.us/database/status/summary. cfm?Bill=S%2E0196&Session=2014

This bill proposes to remove the existing limit on the cumulative output capacity of net metering systems. So that net metering customers contribute to the cost of maintaining and operating the grid, the bill also proposes to require these customers to pay the monthly customer charge billed by the electric company.

Our Committee will monitor the above noted bills and provide additional details as they come available.



SUBJECT: PRESIDENTIAL AWARD OF EXCELLENCE (PAOE)

ASHRAE chapters are the backbone of the Society and play a central role in achieving its goals. Through our collective efforts, ASHRAE chapters are a vital, global driver of progress in building science and technology.

My Presidential theme, "Shaping the Next," focuses on the importance of goals, planning, and commitment to enable us to fulfill our responsibility to our world - making buildings safe, healthy, productive, comfortable environments in harmony with nature - by developing ourselves – the professional community and transforming our work – what we do, how we do it, and who we do it with.

The PAOE for the coming year reflects these points of emphasis. It also includes new section for Grassroots Government Activities, coinciding with the initiation of ASHRAE's new Grassroots Government Activities Committee (GGAC).

Highlights of new activities for which PAOE points will be awarded include:

75 points for establishing and updating annually a chapter long term strategic plan (minimum of 3 years) with goals for chapter growth, leadership, and financial stability.

100 points for a project that provides education and support for Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) in the professional community and/or Society at large

50 points for each chapter program on Indoor Air Quality/Environmental Health

50 points for each chapter program dealing with global issues

150 points for establishing and annually updating a list of government officials (at any level of government relevant to buildings, engineering or construction, including building officials, school system facility staff, state energy code officials, etc.) along with their contact information. In addition, translation of ASHRAE publications by Chapter members will now be given the same credit as authoring an article.

There are seven categories included in this year's PAOE: Chapter Operations, Chapter Technology Transfer, Grassroots Government Activities, Historical, Membership Promotion, Research Promotion, and Student Activities. To achieve PAOE, the chapter must earn the minimum points in five of the following six categories: Chapter Operations, Chapter Technology Transfer, Grassroots Government Activities, Membership Promotion, Research Promotion, and Student Activities. Please refer to the criteria specified in each of the categories for calculating the PAOE points. For additional information or clarification, consult the PAOE Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section on the ASHRAE website. Please note that appropriate documentation must be kept by the Chapter to support PAOE point input, and that "chair" is defined as the individual listed in the Chapter Information Questionnaire (CIQ) on file with Society.

I appreciate the dedication, enthusiasm and hard work you bring to improving our Society and providing value to our membership. I look forward to working with you during the coming year.

Presidential Award of Excellence (PAOE) is the point system ASHRAE Region and Society use to help track the Chapter's activities. The chapter gets points in the below categories for activities that we do throughout the year. The awards banner that you see at the meetings represents CVC's accomplishments over the years. Below are definitions of what some of those awards are. If you want to know more about PAOE check out the www.ashrae.org website and do a search for the PAOE newsletter.

End of Year Awards Available to the Chapter:

PAOE: Minimum in five of the six categories

Special Citation: Minimum in 5 of the 6 categories with a minimum total of 4600 points

STAR: PAR in all categories

Honor Roll: PAOE for at least 4 consecutive years

High Honor Roll: STAR for at least 4 consecutive years

Premier: PAOE every year since the chapter's inception or since 1970; minimum of 4 years; chapter's first year is excluded Sustainability Activities Award: A Chapter Sustainability Award in the form of a certificate is available for each chapter

that obtains a total of at least 200 points from the items listed under Sustainability

Activities in the Chapter Operations category of PAOE. The Chapter with the highest PAOE Sustainability point total will receive a Regional award in the form of a glass plaque and a certificate.Level 1 = less than 100 members; Level 2 = 100-249, Level 3 = 250-449, Level 4 = 500 or more.
